

We can provide support to improve safety, signpost to other services and aid your recovery from the impact of domestic abuse.

Our services

- Being hurt in your own home?
- Threatened by your partner?
- Dreading your partner coming home?
- Walking on eggshells?
- Feeling unsafe even if you've separated?

Do these excuses sound familiar?

"My partner doesn't mean itand always says sorry afterwards."

"It's my fault I keep getting it wrong."

If you recognise that domestic abuse is part of your life we can help you identify your options and support you in your choices.

We can support you with:

Information, Advice and Guidance from our trained staff on our helpdesk.

One to One Support from a dedicated support worker who will help you form a plan to improve your safety and wellbeing.

Workshops for women to identify, come to terms with and overcome the impact of domestic abuse. These are usually held over 12 weekly sessions.

IDVA

When someone is assessed as High Risk they are allocated an Independent Domestic Violence Advisor to provide specialist support with safety planning and attending court. These are provided by several specialist domestic abuse services across Devon.

Children and Young People

We work with children and young people whether they have witnessed abuse or have been part of the abuse; through one to one support, groupwork, toolkits for parents and schools and workshops in schools and colleges.

Voluntary Perpetrator Programme

The aim of this work is to promote the safety of victims and children and change harmful and abusive behaviour. We provide information, advice and onward referral and a structured 25 week group for men who want to change their behaviour. We only accept self-referrals to our perpetrators programme.
