What's Happening This Half- Term?



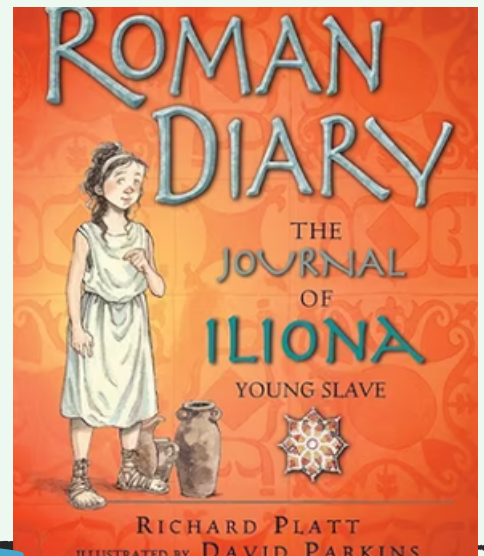
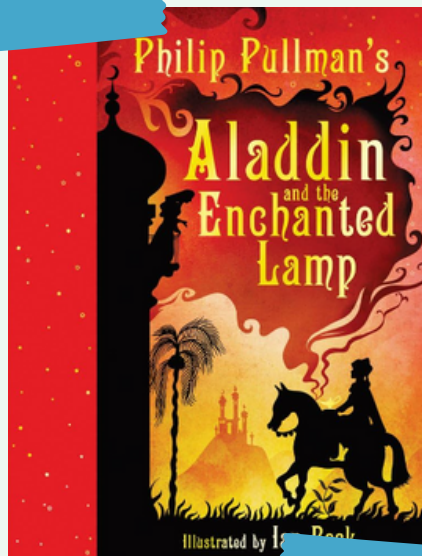
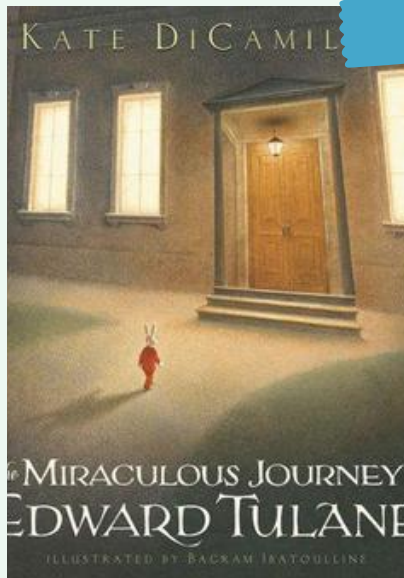

Maths Learning
