Library day is Wednesday. Please can the children bring in any finished library books having quizzed them, so they can get a new one.

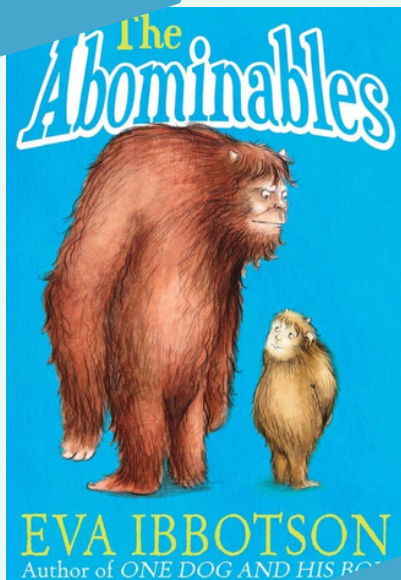
Reading records will be checked every Friday. Please keep this updated as you read with your child and bring it in each week.

Maths Learning

In maths this half-term we will be developing our knowledge of fractions, building on our fractions learning in Spring Term. The children will learn what a fraction is and how this is represented. We will explore finding half and a quarter of shapes and quantities.

This half-term we will also be learning about money. This will involve converting between pounds and pence, adding and subtracting amounts and giving change. You could support this at home by allowing your child to help when shopping.

WIDER CURRICULUM

In Science, we will be investigating animals including humans. We will learn the function of skeletons and muscles, and the importance of diet to survival.

In Geography, we will be exploring Britain's national parks with the aim of being able to answer the question 'Who are Britain's National Parks for?'

We are hoping to spend our PE lessons on the field developing our striking and fielding skills. Please remember to pack sunhats/sun cream due to the warmer weather.



English Learning

In English this half-term, we will be diving into the story of the 'Happy Prince'. This story looks at the themes of social injustice, and the divide between the wealthy and the poor.

After the 'Happy Prince', we will be exploring the anatomy of the animals, and begin to look at creating a fact file on a chosen species!
